Research Project Guidelines

- Your research project should engage with the works we have been reading & discussing as well as with works beyond that context.
- Open topic, form, style, and media.
- Craft a balance between research & creativity, scholarship & interpretation.
- Make connections among the poems and the poetics essays.
- For your research materials, include a mix of literary, cultural & scholarly works.
- Provide evidence from your primary and secondary works. Use either MLA or Chicago format for your citations in either a list of works cited, or in notes.
- Two-page proposal and/or outlines due at the beginning of class on Thursday, May 8. These will not be graded, but your proposal must be approved.
- Your presentation (individual or group) should engage with your research project in-progress.

Project length (undergrads.): 10-12 pages (or the equivalent, depending upon media)

Project length (grads.): 18-20 pages (or the equivalent, depending upon media)

Due: Thursday, June 5
