Essay/Work #3: Adaptation vs. Translation / Translation vs. Adaptation

GUIDELINES:

For this assignment, you have a range of options for the form of what you may choose to create. For example: you may write an essay, or you may write a creative piece; you may also create a mixed-media work.

The crux, no matter which form you choose for your work, is to examine relationships among the BFI *Tempest*, Shakespeare's play, and Wilcox's science fiction adaptation.

How and why do these versions of The Tempest converge & diverge, and how and why do their respective media—that is, their forms of expression, their genres—shape those inter-relationships?

Your primary works for this assignment are the British Film Institute's *Tempest*, Shakespeare's *Tempest*, and Wilcox's *Forbidden Planet*; your secondary text, Manovich's *Language of New Media*, as noted above.

Incorporate evidence (i.e. direct quotation) from all of your primary and secondary sources and provide a works cited page (either MLA or Chicago style).
