The Scholarship & Social Justice Undergraduate Research Conference will be held on April 8th & 9th, 2021. We are pleased to announce that our keynote speaker will be, Roberto G. Gonzalez, professor of education at Harvard Graduate School of Education and director of the newly formed Immigration Initiative at Harvard (IIH), a university-wide effort aimed at advancing and promoting interdisciplinary scholarship and intellectual exchange around issues of immigration policy and immigrant communities. If you are an undergraduate researcher conducting research, independently, as part of a capstone or theses in the area of research that is research focusing on traditionally under-represented or marginalized groups, please consider submitting a proposal.

Others may apply to be part of the poster exhibit. Proposals focused on health, education, political engagement and immigration will be prioritized. All research must be complete by April 1, 2021. Since 2015, we have welcomed over 100 undergraduates from across the nation to present research that amplifies historically muted voices to address issues of equity and justice and to hear from faculty whose work is at the intersection of research and social justice. The conference has become an opportunity for both faculty and undergraduates interested in community engaged scholarship in the academy to come together as a community of established and emerging scholars. We look forward to hearing from a new generation of scholars in April 2021.

For student scholars, this is an opportunity to engage in academic dialogue with peers and faculty mentors. For faculty, this conference presents an opportunity to explore about how other disciplines conduct research that creates new knowledge and understanding about equity and social justice and to be inspired by the next generation of scholars. In particular, we hope that this conference will encourage historically under-represented students to pursue careers in the academy.
