- Proposal (100 words) due at the beginning of class on Thursday, May
 This will be due as a Commonplace Book entry and as a post on
 Canvas in the discussion board forum for Project Proposals.
- Previously written Commonplace Book passages and Essay assignments may contribute to the Project as long as those materials are sufficiently revised in sync with the Project's topic and methods.
