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### **Eighteenth (18th) Judicial District Juvenile Assessment Center- Community Assessment Program**

Interns will utilize a strengths-based approach to assessment to identify concerning behaviors and their underlying factors. Interns will conduct mental health, substance use, and trauma screening to make informed recommendations of supportive services or practices to address identified concerns. Interns will also assist in the coordination of systems to care for youth involved in juvenile justice and/or human service systems. Interns will also have the opportunity to work with school professionals to develop strategies to meet the needs of students and families in their district and participate in community events.

**This is a CLIMB Stipend eligible agency.**

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### **Workforce Development Internship – Denver Economic and Development Internship**

This internship is NOT in the GSSW Internships Database. It is a paid job that runs from mid-May through December. Find a description of the internship here:

Students interests in applying to this job and using this as their required GSSW internship, would need to:

1. Apply to, and secure, the job.
2. Speak to the employer about their willingness to allow this to count towards your GSSW Internship (provide weekly supervision and submit evaluations at the end of quarter and participate in quarterly site visits).
3. Complete an internship in place of employment application to seek approval (contact [field@du.edu](mailto:field@du.edu))
4. Once approved, register for field credits in Summer and Fall quarters (this is an off-cycle field placement that will require a field exceptions form).
5. All hours will be completed in Summer and Fall Quarters (Foundation = 400 hours; Concentration = 500 hours).



### **Sexual Offense Resource Services (SORS)**

This is a forensic mental health experience internship. Interns will participate in group and individual forensic mental health sessions, evaluations, intake and risk assessments, court and parole board testimony and treatment plan development. Interns will learn how to write professional letters and discharge summaries, case management skills, and may attend Approved Supervisor trainings for non-offending support persons. Interns will be placed based on student location in: Lakewood, Colorado Springs, Westminster/Longmont, Rifle, Grand Junction/Delta or Montrose.
