Odyssey School of Denver

Odyssey provides a Forest School Ethos by combining physical adventure tasks, games, and extended trips with seasonal and ecology related themes. Interns at Odyssey will work closely with the Director of Culture and Adventure, as well as an Environmental Education AmeriCorp Member to put on weekly school-wide Forest School Experiences. Interns will support play based ecological literacy experiences, Social and Emotional curriculum, and Mental Health counseling for individuals and groups, as well as Restorative Justice intervention circles. Interns also have the opportunity to help facilitate extended overnight travel learning trips for grades K-8.



Jefferson County Public Schools

Interns may conduct individual or group sessions, assessments, participate in IEPs, and various other school social work related learning activities, depending on specific school settings,

Interns will learn how to effectively approach group facilitation, program and policy planning, community involved data collection, and gain a more nuanced perspective on the experience of homelessness.
