City Year

City Year is an education non-profit that utilizes AmeriCorps volunteers to provide services to youth in grades 3-9 to help them succeed. Interns will engage in mezzo and macro work to support the AmeriCorps volunteers and students by developing and facilitating SEL curriculum, conducting social justice discussion groups, prepare learning and development sessions, help build a database of mental wellness and SEL resources, send out wellness newsletters and participate in individual check-ins with young adults.

This can be used as a work-study site and/or may offer a stipend.



ACLU of Colorado

The ACLU of Colorado is the state's oldest and largest civil rights organization. Our mission is to protect, defend and extend the civil rights and civil liberties of all people in Colorado through litigation, education, and advocacy. Interns will assist with planning and executing various events including informational town halls, outreach events and Know Your Rights workshops. Interns will also have the opportunity to help mobilize ACLU activists and assist the legal team with various tasks as needed.



Brent's Place (Brent Eley Foundation)

Brent's Place provides housing and works to improve the quality of life for children and families living with cancer and other immunocompromising conditions. The Internship gives students a holistic view of a nonprofit and allows students to work with a wide variety of client populations under the umbrella of health care. The main skills students will learn include program management and development, auxiliary use of clinical skills to create a supportive environment for families, volunteer management, and community outreach and resource finding. Interns will participate in research that explores Brent's Place's ability to cater to its residents' needs so they can focus on recovery.
