The Refuge-Refuge Café

The Refuge- Refuge Café provide free lunch, showers, essential items, access to local resources, and a safe place to rest. Interns at The Refuge experience hands-on leading and learning in a non-traditional setting. Interns interact directly with clients of the Cafe who struggle with suburban poverty and pain, mental illness, addictions, homelessness, the effects of immigration and lack of documentation.

Interns also have the opportunity to implement creative ideas for client intake, resource navigation, community partnership and the expansion of Refuge services, participate in the administration and operation of a local severe cold weather center and facilitate community and special events around topics such as anti-racism and affordable housing advocacy.



Mountain Vista Psychology, PLLC

Mountain Vista Psychology is a group private practice who specializes in serving children, teens, and adults who have ADHD, anxiety, trauma, Autism Spectrum, and depression through counseling, neurofeedback, and psych testing.

This internship is a **12 month experience** in which you will get the opportunity to work with children, teens, and adults providing counseling and neurofeedback services.



Jeffco Education Support Professionals' Association (JESPA)

JESPA is a local union representing education support professionals in the 2nd largest school district in Colorado, Jefferson County Public Schools. Interns will be exposed to a wide range of macro and micro level Social Work experience opportunities at JESPA.

Interns will have the flexibility to choose a path of interest and dig deep into the learning and practical application of what they are learning such as: community/union organizing, representing/advocating for employees by providing emotional support, making referrals for community resources, and working with district administration and other community partners.

This is a paid internship and may be work study eligible.
