The Patterson Center
For Resiliency

The Patterson Center for Resiliency, LLC is a small mental health clinic located in Colorado Springs with both hybrid and virtual internship options. The Patterson Center primarily serve children and adults 12+, largely LGBTQIA+ individuals, females, and trauma survivors.

Interns will see 5-7 clients per week for individual therapy, supportive skill-building, case management, be able to engage in research on evidence-based practices and client outcomes throughout the year and have macro and mezzo opportunities including advocating for public policy reform, public education through social media or events, networking, curriculum development, and connecting with referrals.



Denver Family Institute

Denver Family Institute is a non-profit organization offering affordable therapy services to families of all backgrounds. Interns are supervised in clinical work with individuals, couples and families from a strength based, solution focused systems perspective. Interns also do intakes, admin. support, grant writing and clinical skills are the focus through the use of video and live supervision via one-way mirrors.



Denver Children's Home- Intensive In Home Services

Denver Children's Home provides a comprehensive therapeutic and educational continuum of care for our region's abused, neglected, and traumatized children and their families with mental health issues. Interns would be trained to provide direct clinical services (i.e., behavior therapy, and clinical case management) to children and adolescents age 0-17 who have a mental health diagnosis, a history of trauma, abuse, or neglect and behavioral issues that are interfering with functioning at home, in school and/or in the community.

Students will have an opportunity to do individual, family, and group therapy, and related case management, in a variety of settings, including inpatient residential, day treatment, intensive in home, and after school programs, and will work as part of a multidisciplinary team.
