Child, Adolescent, Adult and Family Counseling

Concepts Counseling- formerly Lowry Counseling

Concepts Counseling provide Telehealth and in person counseling services to Child/Adolescents, Individuals, Couples and Families. Interns will see any number of clientele, with an assortment of backgrounds, age, and possibly socioeconomic backgrounds.



Adoption Options- Fostering Healthy Futures

Fostering Healthy Futures (FHF) is an evidence-based mentoring and skills training program for youth with child welfare involvement or who are at risk for child welfare involvement. FHF has opening for interns in their Mentorship program and as Skill Group Assistants. The Mentorship program provides mentoring support to foster youth by engaging them in guided self-assessments, vision and goal-setting exercises, individualized skills training, and workshops to enable youth to move towards and achieve their goals. As Skill Group Assistants, interns will help co-lead the mentor skills group and participate in planning group activities with the group supervisors.



Spark the Change- Health Corps

Spark the Change Health Corps is seeking MSW interns to serve as AmeriCorps members. Interns will be placed at public charter schools and serve as school mental health associates. This is a great internship opportunity for students interested in advancing their mental health experience and sharpening clinical skills in a school-based setting. Interns will do 675 hours (internship may be eligible for extra credits) and should be available to start on August 15 for training. This is a stipend position- all members receive a stipend of \$7,425 over the course of the service term and an additional \$2474 educational award at the end that can be put towards loans or other educational expenses.

This internship offers a paid internship.
