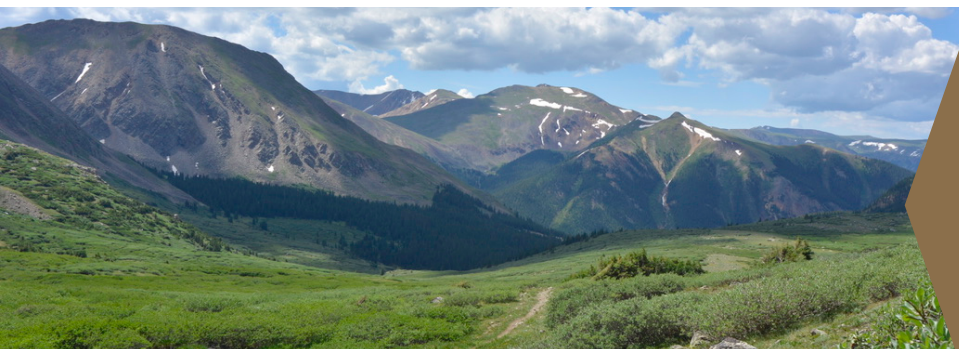

The Summer Internship Award Program is designed to increase the ability for students to participate in internship opportunities that are unpaid. The program will award undergraduate students with awards ranging from \$2,500-\$3,400, depending on the award origin (the Career & Professional Development Award, the Deneberg Family Award, or the CAHSS Award). If you have secured an unpaid internship for this summer, or have some in the works, please consider applying. These are great awards! The deadline to [apply](#) is this Friday, April 17th (Yes, that's tomorrow!) at noon.

The internship is for 12 weeks and responsibilities will include leading public and political outreach in your state and district. Duties include meeting with members of Congress and/or Congressional staffers in your State and District, assisting with fundraising, mobilizing individuals to contact their members of Congress in support of key poverty-reduction legislation, and writing letters of support for key programs to political leaders, media and other groups.
