



Foreign Service Office Management Specialist

A strong command of the English language, superior office management skills, and in-depth knowledge of office computer software are essential for this position. Donald M. Payne International Development Fellowship

DEADLINE: 1 NOVEMBER 2019

The Payne International Development Fellowship is a program is a highly competitive national fellowship program that identifies and trains outstanding individuals for careers in the Foreign Service of the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). It welcomes the application of members of minority groups historically underrepresented in the field of development and those with financial need. Requirements include U.S. citizenship, plans to attend graduate school in Fall 2020, and cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher. The program includes up to \$38,000 towards tuition and other fees for a two-year master's degree in fields related to international development and two summer internships. Temporary 2020 Census Workers

In the spring of 2020, the Census Bureau will launch the largest 2020 Census field operation, known as Nonresponse Follow-up, Census Takers will knock on doors to follow up with households who have not responded to the census questionnaire. Applicants can qualify for both field and office positions. The office positions, which are more limited, will be located in area census offices. The role of these offices is to recruit, select, hire, train, manage, and pay all office and field staff who work within the designated boundaries of the geographic territory assigned to the office.
