### Fellowships & Scholarships

#### James Gaither Fellowship

The James C. Gaither Junior Fellows Program allows recent graduates to work in D.C. for one year as research assistants at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. DU can nominate up to three students if one of those students comes from a historically underrepresented group. Gaither Junior Fellows provide research assistance to scholars working on Carnegie. They have the opportunity to conduct research, contribute to op-eds, papers, reports, and books, edit documents, participate in meetings with high-level officials, contribute to congressional testimony and organize briefings attended by scholars, activists, journalists and government officials.

To be nominated by DU your application is due 7 December 2020 at 12pm MST, if chosen the Fellowship deadline is 15 January 2020 - to be considered by DU these materials must be submitted by 7 December 2020: Application form, One-page essay about why you would like to become a junior fellow, Resume/C.V., Topic essay (no more than 3 pages). The letters of recommendation and transcripts can be submitted later, but it would be a good idea to begin thinking about who could write you two letters.

#### Gilman-McCain Scholarship

The U.S. Department of State's Gilman-McCain Scholarship provides awards of \$5,000 for undergraduate child dependents of active duty service members to study or intern abroad on credit-bearing programs. This scholarship enables students to develop the leadership and career readiness skills and global perspective to pursue careers of service and contribute to preserving the principles and alliances that are critical to an international order based on the rule of law, human rights, and democracy. #### The Institute of Current World Affairs Fellowship Program (ICWA)

This is a program designed to advance a deep knowledge of global cultures and affairs for individuals early in their careers.
