The Alfa Fellowship Program is a distinguished international initiative that each year offers up to 18 accomplished young Americans, Britons, and Germans the opportunity to complete a high-level professional development program in Russia. Over the course of the program, fellows complete work placements at leading institutions, attend professional seminars, and receive intensive language training. The fellowship provides a monthly stipend, accommodation, insurance, all program-related travel costs, language training in Russia, and private tutoring in the U.S., U.K., or Germany. The Alfa Fellowship Program was founded in 2004 with the aim of fostering a community of emerging leaders who have first-hand experience in the business, public policy, and cultural environments of Russia and the region. The Key goals of the Alfa Fellowship Program are to expand networks of American, British, German, and Russian professionals, develop greater intercultural understanding, and advance knowledge of Russian affairs in the West.

The Fund for American Students (TFAS)

Washington DC (and Virtual)

TFAS Offers multiple different internships throughout the year!

Fall + Spring Academic Internship Programs in Washington, DC: Through the Capital Semester program, TFAS brings students from across the U.S. and world to Washington for 15 weeks. Students will earn 12 credits from George Mason University, be placed in an internship within their fields of interest, and live in furnished apartments in the Capitol Hill neighborhood, just blocks from the Library of Congress and U.S. Capitol. The fall semester focuses public policy and international affairs, while the spring semester's theme is Leadership and the American Presidency. The spring program is sponsored in conjunction with the Ronald Reagan Institute.

Spring 2021 Deadline: November 16

Summer Academic Internship Program in Washington, DC: The summer program provides students from across the U.S. and abroad the opportunity to spend 8 weeks earning 3-9 credits from George Mason University, complete an internship placement in their field of interest, and live on George Washington University's campus – located just a few blocks from the State Department and White House. Our goal is to provide a real-world professional and academic experience for college students to help prepare them for responsible leadership in the future. Five program tracks are offered during the summer: Public Policy and Economics, International Affairs, Journalism and Communications, Business and Government Relations, and Leadership and the American Presidency.

Although unpaid, the internship is an opportunity for those interested in learning more in the field of international law, international human rights and international humanitarian law, as well as multilateral diplomacy, to gain insight, knowledge, and professional experience.

Student Scholarships:

Our merit-based scholarships are awarded twice per year to support and encourage women studying all aspects of International Trade including commercial relations, trade policy and negotiations, economic development, women's economic empowerment, and more.

- Applicants must identify as female and be currently enrolled at an accredited U.S. university or college, either full-time or part-time. Applicants must be undergraduate Juniors or Seniors or enrolled in graduate studies.
- Awards (\$1,500) will be based on the quality of the assigned essay and the applicant's demonstrated interested in international trade, and are made without regard to race, religion, age, national origin, ability, sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Selected winners will receive \$1,500 and:
 - One full year of personal mentorship by a WIIT Trust or a WIIT member
 - One full year of WIIT membership
 - One WIIT program based on the topic of the winning essay with knowledgeable professionals from the WIIT community
 - Scholarship winner will have a visible opportunity to engage in a role in the panel discussion.

Application Requirements:

Essays must be on a relevant international trade topic (see suggestions below) and can either be a bespoke essay submission or an appropriately formatted existing academic paper from current class works. Submissions must be:

- Minimum 5, and Maximum 10 numbered pages (exclusives of endnotes, bibliography, if used)
- Typed, double spaced, 12 pt Times New Roman font
- In PDF format
- Submitted to info@wiittrust.org

Application deadlines are April 1st and November 1st, and winners will be notified by May 15th and December 15th, respectively.

Suggested Essay Topics:

- Trade & Development trade policy impact on Sustainable Development Goals
- Trade & Empowerment trade policy impact on gender diversity and economic empowerment
- Trade Agreements select a current agreement and discuss trade impact on a specific industry and/or specific labor/workforce impact.
- US Trade policy analyze current US trade agreement against defined US trade policy goals
