Campus Gears up for October 20th

The University of Denver is an official local site for the National Day on Writing, and we invite members of the entire campus community to share their writing and participate in activities led by the Writing Program. The Day on Writing spotlights one of humankind's most central and important activities: writing, in all its myriad forms. Sponsors of the Day are the National Council of Teachers of English and 15 partners, including Google Docs, the Newseum, USA *Today.* the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the National Center for Family Literacy, the National Council of Social Studies, and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics.

One aspect of the day is a National Gallery of Writing, a site where people who perhaps have never thought of themselves as writers—mothers, bus drivers, fathers, veterans, nurses, firefighters, sanitation workers, stockbrokers—select and post one thing they have written that is important to them. The Gallery accommodates any composition format—from word processing to photography, audio recording to text messages.
