Dear CWC Students, Staff, and Faculty,

The hate-filled massacre of nine people last week at an evening prayer meeting at Emmanuel AME Church in Charleston, South Carolina has left that community, and communities across the country, reeling. Many folks at CWC and in the wider DU campus have been looking for an opportunity to process their feelings about this horrific event.

Associate Dean Arthur Jones has been discussing this with Dean Olson, the Chancellor, and the staff at the Center for Multicultural Excellence, and has organized an opportunity this week for anyone in the CWC community who would like a safe place to share feelings about what happened in Charleston. Everyone from the CWC community is invited to take part in the discussion facilitated by the Associate Dean.
