International Travel Course to Uruguay- Summer Quarter

Course: LAS 3600 | Uruguay - Case Study in Regulating New Markets: Cannabis in the 21st Century

On-campus class dates: Tuesdays, 6:00-9:00pm, June 16, 30, July 14, August 4, 11

Travel Dates: August 15-22, 2015

Application/Scholarship Deadline: May 31, 2015

Travel Fee: \$4000 (Includes airfare, accommodations, transportation, and all official course activity fees)

This course will introduce students to various ways in which new markets can become regulated, focusing on variations to national/international drug policy. Students will contrast and compare the monumental shift in marijuana policy in Uruguay to that which is occurring in Colorado, other U.S. States, and the world. The class will work closely with the Universidad Católica del Uruguay, the Uruguayan government, business interests, and related activist groups.
