That edition has a good intro. plus useful appendices.

If you have time before our first meeting, I invite you to:

- Read some of the play, as much or as little as your time will permit; and/or
- View some of the three film adaptations we will be studying: the silent film, *The Tempest* (1908); the classic sci-fi feature- length production, *Forbidden Planet* (1957-58); and Peter Greenaway's masterpiece, *Prospero's Books* (1991).
- To view those films, go to DU Course Media, <u>http://coursemedia.du.edu/</u>, login w/ your DU ID & password, then find and open the course gallery, *Special Topics: 20th Cent Lit 4650*. Once there, click on the gallery titled, "Tempest Adaptations." The 1908 Tempest (12 min.) is the second in the Silent Shakespeare collection, preceded by a very brief (3 min.) and very grim King John (1899), which you'll also appreciate (especially in comparison w/ Percy Stow's 1908 version).
