Let's talk Security Clearance...

Many jobs in the public and private sector require them & it is important to think about keeping your record clean now, so you can get that dream job in the future. Here are five steps to make sure you will pass your security clearance when the time comes.

1. Track Where You Go, As You Go

- a. Time spent outside the US in the last ten years must be recorded (especially if you lived there for 90 days or more)
- b. Record: day, month & year you begin/ended the trip
- c. If you lived there record your address and landlord info

2. Remember Who You Know

- a. As you build relationships with people outside the US (a.k.a "foreign nationals") record when your relationship started and your last contact with them
- b. It is also important to record any foreign governmental affiliations they may have

3. Maintain Relationships

- a. Have at least three or more friends, colleagues, roommates, etc. that can speak knowledgeably to your character
- b. You must have known them for 7 plus years and they can not be family

4. Understand Your Financial Situation

- a. Track your finances and credit score
- b. Be aware of any debt you have, as employers may see that as a leveraging point that foreign entities can use against you

5. Safeguard Your Social Media

- a. Google yourself to see what employers will find out about you
- b. Do not include personal information in online profiles
- c. Do not illegally download things
- d. Consider how your posts and photos represent you
- e. Know who follows you, the employer may contact them
- a. Never post about applying for or accepting a position with a security clearence
