2022 Summer Internship Award Program

The Summer Internship Award Program through Career & Professional Development is now live and ready for applicants! The Summer Internship Award Program is designed to increase the ability for students to participate in internship opportunities that are unpaid. Internships may be on or off the DU campus. **The deadline to apply is 4/15/22 @ 5 pm.** Filling out an application will make you eligible for any of the below internships for which you qualify! The program will award undergraduate students with awards ranging from \$2,500-\$3,400, depending on the award origin (the Career & Professional Development Award, the Sturm Award, the Denenberg Family Award, or the CAHSS Award). A Selection Committee will review the applications and essays and will notify students via email to let them know whether or not they have been selected to receive the award.
