OMNI

Research Fellowship Program

As a brief summary, OMNI is hiring three Fellows for 13 months. This is an entry-level position in their field of social sciences research and evaluation. Students of color (and those with other historically marginalized identities) are especially encouraged who are graduating this spring to consider applying for this position and joining OMNI for a year of exploration and learning.

For the 2022-2023 class, OMNI will welcome three Fellows to OMNI Institute as full-time employees for 13 months (anticipated June 1st 2022 to June 30th 2023). Applications are now open and will be for the coming weeks as they receive and review applications. During the 13-month program as anticipated:

Fellows will spend approximately 75% of their time working on client projects as Research Assistants. They will support data collection and analysis, take notes in team and client meetings, and learn the basics of working across multiple client engagements in a consulting environment.

The remaining 25% of their time will be spent on learning and career development opportunities. Such as:

Learning from OMNI's various methodological best practice teams and exploring their content areas of work in Behavioral Health, Community Health, Justice, Children & Families, and Economic Security.

Shadowing their project leads and staff as they attend client meetings, conduct community outreach, and participate in other external engagements.

One-on-one time with their organization's senior leaders to learn about career pathways and explore what it's like to work in the social sciences and in consulting at an advanced level.

Career planning support with things like resume prep, graduate school applications, reference letters, introductions to clients and funders, etc.

Note: We cannot guarantee opportunities to stay with OMNI as employees after the Research Fellowship concludes, and anticipate most Fellows will explore other career opportunities or pursue a Master's degree.

A paid 10-week program, Institute for Policy Studies Next Leaders program offers young activists training in public scholarship, that is, the connection between policy research, advocacy, and grassroots activism. Through its workshop and events series and individualized mentorship, Next Leaders looks to sharpen young scholar-activists' voices and hone their skills. In addition to hands-on experience, each cohort will leave the program with a more nuanced understanding of environmental, racial, economic, gender, and peace justice. Responsibilities will include leading public and political outreach in your state and district.

- Meet with members of Congress and/or Congressional staffers in your State and District.
- Represent The Borgen Project at various business, political and community events.
- Assist with fundraising. Create a personal fundraising campaign and meet targets.
- Mobilize individuals to contact their members of Congress in support of key poverty-reduction legislation.
- As needed, speak to groups, classes and organizations.
- Write letters of support for key programs to political leaders, media and other groups.
