- ***Okay so the job you want doesn't have any internships listed -- why not email them?***

Lots of smaller international organizations are struggling through this pandemic as well. It's likely that they are still trying to decide if they are bringing interns on this fall. If you really want to work there, it is worth reaching out to them to express your interest. This could be through their general email or through an alumnus of Korbels you found on LinkedIn. Feasibly, the worst thing they can tell you is that they're not taking interns this fall, but even in that case, now they know your name!

- ***Troll those job boards***

There are a lot of people looking for internships and jobs right now -- the market is incredibly saturated. Stay ahead of the game by setting up a schedule for yourself to see new positions as soon as they're available. You can do this by scrolling through LinkedIn (which you totally listened to our advice and got), PCO, and the organization that you like's Careers page.

- ***Make your resumé and cover letter stand out***

This should not be read as "make your resumé and cover letter as loud as possible with weird fonts and bright colors." Your information stands out by being an excellent representation of who you are, what you want to do, and what you can add to their organization. "But Mari," you may be thinking, "how do I even do this?? Writing resumé suuuuuuuuuck." And you would be correct about that. Humanitarian Affairs Intern

HALO Trust -- Remote

Deadline: July 12, 2020

The HALO Trust (USA) is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization specializing in the removal of landmines and other explosive remnants of war, with projects in 25+ countries and territories employing almost 9,000 people. HALO's Washington, DC office works with foundations, government partners, international agencies and private donors to increase awareness of the impact of landmines and ERW on post-conflict communities and to raise funds to support HALO's teams working overseas. The DC office is seeking an enthusiastic intern interested in US politics and international affairs to support HALO's government affairs and private fundraising staff with Congressional advocacy, grant management efforts, and donor stewardship. The Borgen Project -- Remote

The Borgen Project is an innovative, national campaign that is working to make poverty a focus of U.S. foreign policy. This is a part-time 12-hours per week, unpaid telecommuting internship. The internship is for 12 weeks and responsibilities will include leading public and political outreach in your state and district. Interns will meet with members of Congress and/or Congressional staffers in your State and District, represent The Borgen Project at various business, political and community events, assist with fundraising, create a personal fundraising campaign and meet targets, mobilize individuals to contact their members of Congress in support of key poverty-reduction legislation, as needed, speak to groups, classes and organizations, and write letters of support for key programs to political leaders, media and other groups.
