What fellowships can I apply to?

Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship Program DEADLINE: 17 SEPTEMBER 2019

The Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship Program is a program funded by the U.S. Department of State that prepares young people for Foreign Service careers. It welcomes the application of members of minority groups historically underrepresented in the State Department, women, and those with financial need. Requirements include U.S. citizenship, plans to attend graduate school in Fall 2020, and cumulative GPA of 3.2 or

higher. The program includes up to \$37,500 towards tuition and other fees for a two-year master's degree in fields related to the Foreign Service and two summer internships. For more information and to apply, visit pickeringfellowship.org.

Rangel International Affairs Graduate Fellowship Program

DEADLINE: 24 SEPTEMBER 2019

The Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Fellowship can lead to a career in the U.S. Department of State Foreign Service, a uniquely rewarding career of international service. Fellowships are short-term learning opportunities that typically span from a few months to two years. Many associations sponsor fellowships to give financial support to budding young professionals in exchange for their work in the field
