Eligibility for Dual Degree Program (Must Complete Prior to Formal Application)

- Active Standing BA INTS Major at the University of Denver
- Complete INTS 1500, INTS 1700, INTS 2975 with B+ or better
- Complete Two 3000-Level Courses (with B+ or Better)
- Overall DU GPA of 3.50 (A- Equivalent)
- Submit Informal Application and Letter of Intent by December 1st of Sophomore Year

Formal Application Requirements for Korbel MA Program (by February 1st of Junior Year)

- Online Application Includes: Statement of Purpose, Resume, GRE Scores, Official Transcripts, and Two Letters of Recommendation from DU Faculty (with at least one from INTS appointed faculty) (Note: GRE scores are not required for students with a INTS Major GPA of 3.75 or above.)

Overall Program Requirements

- Must Maintain Overall Institutional GPA of 3.50 (A- Equivalent)
- Cannot Take More Than 60 Credit Hours of INTS Courses (Including the 24 credits of graduate coursework taken during Year 4.)
- Core INTS Requirements (3 Courses) (with B+ or Better)
- INTS Specialization (3 Courses)
 - Two 3000-Level Specialization Courses (with B+ or Better)
 - One 4000-Level Specialization Course
- INTS Electives
 - A key feature of this program is that in your senior year, your elective credits will double-count towards both BA and MA requirements
 - Thus, all INTS electives must be 4000-level and fit into your chosen MA degree program requirements
